Depending on the formulation and country, tramadol may be prescribed for certain types of moderate to moderately severe pain. It is available in different formulations, including immediate-release and extended-release products.

The appropriate formulation and dose depend on individual circumstances. Age, kidney and liver function, other medicines, medical conditions, and the nature of the pain can all influence whether tramadol is appropriate.

How Does Tramadol Affect the Body?

Tramadol has a dual mechanism of action. Its opioid activity can reduce the perception of pain, while its effects on serotonin and norepinephrine pathways also contribute to its analgesic properties.

These effects can also explain some of the medicine's potential side effects. People taking tramadol may experience dizziness, nausea, constipation, sleepiness, headache, or fatigue.

Some people may be more sensitive to the medicine than others. Factors such as age, other medications, medical conditions, and individual differences in metabolism can affect how tramadol behaves in the body.

For this reason, patients should follow their prescription carefully and should not change the dose without consulting their h
